SNOW REMOVAL

With winter approaching, we want to remind residents that city ordinance prohibits the following during snowstorm events.

1. Parking any vehicle, trailer, boat or other item on any city right of way when the removal of snow from streets is apparent or imminent or when deemed necessary by the city or sheriff.

2. Placing any objects in the city right of way such as dumpsters, basketball standards or other objects that would impair snow removal. (Garbage cans are an exception, but should be removed within 10 hours after garbage has been collected.)

Main Roads or arterial streets are plowed first. Secondary and residential routes are plowed as time and storm duration permits. Cul-de-sacs and dead end roads are plowed last.

Keep in mind that any person who fails to comply with these requirements may be issued a warning and if the violation continues for 24 hours a citation will be issued. Additionally, vehicles or times in the city right of way illegally may be removed under the direction of the sheriff's office.

WASTE WATER

Have you ever heard of salting a field? How about salting a river?

Even though "salting a river" isn't a real phrase, the effects created by salt are just as harmful to our rivers, streams, lakes, and groundwater as they are to a field. However, unlike a field, our water cannot recover from these side effects. This accumulation and persistence of chloride from salt constantly poses a risk to water quality and the plants, animals, and humans who depend upon it.

It is important to keep our walkways safe from slippery ice, but let's all do our part to limit our impact on our streams, lakes, rivers, and groundwater. We can do this by limiting the amount of salt used on our sidewalks, driveways, and parking lots.
